## Writing Courses

(3 credits per course)

**ENG 121-English Composition I** emphasizes the planning, writing and revising of composition, including the development of critical and logical thinking skills.

**ENG 122-English Composition II** expands and refines the objectives of ENG 121. This course emphasizes critical/logical strategies, and writing analytical, evaluative and/or persuasive papers that incorporate research.

**ENG 131-Technical Writing I** develops skills one can apply to a variety of technical documents.

**ENG 221-Creative Writing I** teaches techniques for creative writing by exploring imaginative uses of language through writing short stories, poetry and creative nonfiction.

**ENG 222-Creative Writing II** continues the development of expression covered in ENG 221.

**ENG 226-Fiction Writing** teaches techniques for creating fiction, including the study and appreciation of the language and forms of the short story.

**ENG 227-Poetry Writing** is a workshop class that teaches the elements of poetry. Students will create their own poems and critique others' works.

**ENG 230-Creative Nonfiction** teaches students to incorporate literary techniques into factual writings which include biographical profiles, travel writing and memoirs.

**ENG 235-Rhetoric and Propaganda** examines classical and modern theories of rhetoric, understood as effective, ethical means of persuasion, then seeks to examine the ways in which propaganda departs from these means.

**LIT 115-Introduction to Literature** introduces students to fiction, poetry and drama.

**THE 105-Introduction to the Theatre Arts** includes discussions, workshops and lectures designed to discover, analyze and evaluate all aspects of the theatre experience: scripts, acting, directing, staging, criticism and theory.

**JOU 105-Introduction to Mass Media** places the mass media in a historical and cultural perspective to study the relationship between mass media and society. This course also introduces students to some of the ethical, legal and economic issues that affect the mass media and their consumers.

**FVT 250-Scriptwriting for Film and Video** develops screenwriting skills, focusing on the basic format of the craft, scene constructions, genre inventions, three act structure, characterization and idea generation.

## Writing Credentials

Arapahoe Community College offers an 18-credit credentialing specialty for students pursuing careers in the writing fields.
